Zoroastrianism is the religion and philosophy based on the teachings ascribed to the prophet <u>Zoroaster</u> (Zarathustra, Zartosht). Mazdaism is the religion that acknowledges the divine authority of <u>Ahura Mazda</u>, proclaimed by Zoroaster to be the one uncreated Creator of all (God).

Zoroastrianism was the first of the revealed monotheisms. It profoundly influenced Judaism and, in turn, Christianity and Islam (Boyce, 1929). Fundamental religious concepts, such as the Resurrection, appeared first in Zoroastrianism (Ring, 1887). In its native Iran, Zoroastrianism was largely displaced by Islam in the 7th century. Today it survives as a small worldwide religion with its largest center in India.
